

I propose the following By-Laws changes. Remove Article VI, Section 7B. and replace with the following:

- B. **EAST OHIO REGION COMPETITION PROGRAMS DIRECTOR:** The East Ohio Region Competition Programs Director (E.O.R.C.P.D.) is generally responsible for the execution of the East Ohio Region's Championship Series Program, Most Valuable Participants Program and the Event Workers Program established by the region. The E.O.R.C.P. Director shall present the current individual standings in each East Ohio Region Competition Program listed above at each regional meeting.

The E.O.R.C.P. Director may present new programs and/or rules for the various East Ohio Region competition programs listed above at the regional meetings prior to the final meeting of the year. Proposed changes shall be voted on at the final meeting of the year.

I propose the following changes to the Standing Rules and Operating Procedures of the East Ohio Region, NCCC (As amended May 12, 2001)

Change #1 – Under 'AWARDS' remove wording under number 2. relating to the 'MVP Award' and add the following:

2. Most Valuable Participant (MVP) Program awards and Event Worker (EV) Program awards shall be presented based on guidelines and rules presented below under "East Ohio Region Competition Programs". Cost of each award is not to exceed amount allowed in regional budget. Championship Series Program awards shall be presented based on guidelines and rules presented below under "East Ohio Region Competition Programs. Cost of each award is provided for in that program.

Change #2 - Under 'CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES' remove the wording including the title and add the following:

EAST OHIO REGION COMPETITION PROGRAMS

1. The East Ohio Region Competition Programs shall consist of three separate, independent programs unique to the East Ohio Region:
- A. The Championship Series Program
 - B. The Most Valuable Participants Program
 - C. The Event Workers Program

The guidelines and rules for each program are attached to the Standing Rules and Operating Procedures of the East Ohio Region, NCCC (Amended).

2. No changes shall be made to the East Ohio Region Competition Programs (see attached) during the competition year except for safety.
3. Proposed changes to the East Ohio Region Competition Program guidelines and rules must be submitted by the fall regional meeting. Such proposed changes will be voted on at the final regional meeting of the year for the following year.

EAST OHIO REGION EVENT WORKERS PROGRAM

The purpose of this program is to reward event volunteers; those who want to participate in sanctioned events but not necessarily compete. They are the ultimate volunteers.

A National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) member who works at an NCCC sanctioned event can earn points as per current rulebook section 8.1.2.5.

To be eligible for an East Ohio Region Event Workers Award an NCCC member must work a minimum of 15 events and accrue a minimum of 30 worker points within a competition year. All workers earning 30 or more worker points will be eligible for an award.

EAST OHIO REGION MOST VALUABLE PARTICIPANT PROGRAM

The purpose of this program is to reward the regions most all around participants.

A National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) member who competes in this program will be expected to participate in both competition type events and non-competition type events in addition to working at events and staging an event.

To be eligible for the Most Valuable Participant (MVP) Program Award (men and woman category) an NCCC member must compete in a minimum of 60% (rounding up) of the sanctioned events in the East Ohio Region (EOR) that are scheduled as of the EOR banquet date (spring meeting) or March 1st whichever comes first. By that date the number and type of events will be determined by the EOR Competition Program Director based on parameters below and presented to the membership at the spring meeting.

The 60% is broken down further as follows:

- A. 90% of the above 60% will be made up from only the following competition type events including High Speed, Low Speed, Drags, Economy Runs, Non Chance Rallys and Concours.
- B. One must participate in at least 4 of each of the above listed competition type events (or all of the scheduled events in each category if less than 4).
- C. 10% of the above 60% will be made up from only one non competition type event – People's Choice Concours.
- D. If there are not enough of the competition type events to satisfy the 90% requirement the remainder of the 90% will be made up of non competition type events.
- E. The individual average for the MVP award will be the total of all earned points divided by the total number of eligible events above.
- F. The points are found in the current NCCC rule book in sections 8.1.2.1, 8.1.2.2 and 8.1.2.3.

- G. There will be one award for women and one award for men. Awards will be given to those with the highest individual average. Ties will be broken using the highest average percentages of 4 concourses.
(or less)
- H. In addition to competing in 60% of the scheduled events in order to qualify for the MVP award one must work in 4 events (earning only 2 points per event) and chair or co-chair 1 event (earning 9 points).

EAST OHIO REGION CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES PROGRAM

The purpose of this program is to provide the East Ohio Region (E.O.R.) membership with a limited program of competition that concentrates on the core of the sanctioned events. This program provides an opportunity to the membership that wants to participate in a limited manner and still be competitive in a regional program.

1. Qualifications and Groupings
 - A. To be eligible for an E. O. R. Championship Series Program award a member must compete in a minimum of 8 sanctioned events in one of two following groups: E. O. R. Championship Speed Series or E. O. R. Championship Non-Speed Series.
 - B. The EOR Championship Speed Series will consist of a total of 10 sanctioned events per year from two categories : High Speed Events and Low Speed Events.
 - C. The EOR Championship Non-Speed Series will consist of a total of 10 sanctioned events per year from two categories : Concours Events and Non-Chance Rally Events.
 - D. Individuals must use the same Corvette for Concours and Speed Events but may use any Corvette in Rallys.
2. Awards
 - A. Awards in the EOR Championship Speed Series will be based on the highest point totals of the best 8 out of 10 events per grouping. Awards in the EOR Championship Non-Speed Series will be based on the highest average percentages of the best 8 out of 10 events per grouping.
 - B. Awards will be given in First Place, Second Place and Third Place for both men and ladies in each group.
3. Events
 - A. Scheduling
 1. The scheduling dates are March 1st or the EOR Banquet which ever comes last through November 31st. Event dates will be selected at the Spring Regional Meeting.
 - a. A total of 10 events in each grouping.
 - b. It is suggested that events in the same grouping be scheduled 3 weeks apart if possible.
 - c. One event per weekend.
 2. Events may be scheduled on any Sunday (preferably) or recognized holiday, and its place in the running order will be determined by the event chairperson.
 3. Categories
 - a. Concours
 - b. Non-Chance Rallys
 - c. High Speed
 - d. Low Speed

4. Judges for EOR Championship Non-Speed Series Concours must be made up of event participants. All participants in the EOR Championship Non-Speed Series Concours events must judge at least one class. Judging must be done according to section 7.5 of the N.C.C.C. Rulebook.
5. Corner workers for the EOR Championship Speed Series events must be made up of event participants. All participants in the EOR Championship Speed Series must work at least one full run.

B. Bidding

1. The last place finishing club from the previous year is given first choice to select an event from any scheduling month.
2. Clubs that are in good standing in the Region are permitted to select dates during each round using the order of their standing on the final Regional Standings Report for the first two (2) rounds.
3. Round One
 - a. Each Club, in reverse order of previous years finish, may select a date for an event from any Scheduling Month.
 - b. Only one (1) event per Club may be chosen during Round One.
 - c. Each Club must have an opportunity to schedule an event before Round Two begins.
4. Round Two
 - a. Each Club is given an opportunity to schedule an event during any Scheduling Month.
 - b. Continue, Club by Club, until all desired dates in Scheduling Months have been chosen.
5. Round Three
 - a. If any events remain, each Club may select a date from the Scheduling Month. Clubs without an EOR Championship Series event will be given preference over those that do. Ties will be broken by a game of chance.
 - b. Clubs may exchange dates at this time.
6. If 8 or less events in a particular group are bid – then a participant must participate in all events that have been bid. If an event is canceled, the number of events remaining will be what qualifies.

C. Flyers

1. Must be completed and mailed (and E-mailed) according to N.C.C.C. rules.
2. One (1) copy must be mailed directly to the East Ohio Region Competition Program Director.
3. Must show "EAST OHIO REGION CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES".
 - a. Failure to do so will result in a \$5.00 fine payable to the East Ohio Region.
 - b. Corrected flyers must be mailed to each Club Governor within thirty (30) days prior to the event.

D. Pricing

1. The East Ohio Championship Series event pricing has been set as a "gentlemen's agreement" by the Regional Board of Directors. "Not to exceed" prices agreed upon are as follows :
 - a. Rallys and Low Speeds - \$10.00
 - b. Concours - \$12.00
 - c. High Speeds - \$25.00

E. Results

1. Must be completed according to N.C.C.C. rules and the following :
 - a. Color, Year and License Plate Number of each Corvette must be noted on the results sheets, except for rallys.
 - b. Percentages must be shown on all Concours and Rally results.
2. Must be mailed to the East Ohio Region Competition Program Director within fifteen (15) days following the event.
 - a. Failure to do so will result in a \$5.00 fine payable to the East Ohio Region.
3. A check in the amount of \$1.00 per N.C.C.C. entrant must accompany all results sheets, payable to the East Ohio Region.

F. Cancellations

1. The host Club must notify the East Ohio Region Competition Program Director by phone (or E-mail) as soon as possible.
2. Rescheduling of events must be approved by the Regional Board of Governors.

4. Points

- A. Points will be awarded for actual competition only.
 1. There are no chairperson(s), worker, host or travel points.
 2. Any N.C.C.C. member may earn points.
 3. Chairperson and Co-Chairperson of Concours and Speed events have the option to participate in the event.
 4. Points for FTD remain at "9".
- B. In Concours and Speed events, points can be transferred from one division to another. In Rally events, points can be transferred between the two (2) divisions of Driver and Navigator.
- C. The East Ohio Region Competition Program Director will distribute a points report at each Regional Meeting, commencing at the first Regional Meeting following the first EOR Championship Series event.
- D. Ties
 1. The ninth (9) and tenth (10) (if needed) events will be used to break a tie.
 2. If unable to break a tie, awards will be given to both parties.

5. Rules

- A. No changes will be made during the competition year except for safety.
- B. Proposed changes are to be submitted and discussed at the October (Fall) Regional Meeting. Proposed changes will be voted on at the December (Winter) Regional Meeting.
